A Second Chance at Life: Audrey's Journey with Danon Disease and a Donor Heart

Audrey's journey with heart disease began early. At just 14 years old, she was diagnosed with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy (HCM), a condition that would eventually lead to even more significant health challenges. On August 15, 2024, at the age of 25, Audrey received a life-saving heart transplant, forever changing her life.



HCM is a condition where the heart muscle becomes abnormally thick, making it harder for the heart to pump blood effectively. While some people with HCM experience few symptoms, others may suffer from shortness of breath, chest pain, or even heart failure. Audrey's diagnosis at 14 marked the beginning of her battle...
